acquired experience in litigation, both Magistrate Court and High Court matters on criminal practice and personal injury disputes.

His contract of articles was ceded in 1997 October to Goodman & Jacobs, a commercial firm of Attorneys and Conveyancers in Pretoria. He acquired extensive experience in commercial litigation (mainly contractual and insurance litigation) and conveyancing. He was involved, with the senior partners, in the preparation of conveyancing documents (both bond and transfer) for the banks, (the big four) and government institutions. He also acquired extensive experience in litigation matters for personal injuries claimants, Standard bank of South Africa and Commercial Union.

Subsequent to his admission as Attorney and Conveyancer in 1998, he was appointed as a Professional Assistant by Seriti Mavundla Attorneys, a firm which specialized in personal insurance disputes, Collections and Conveyancing. Both Messrs. Seriti and Mavundla have now been appointed as judges of the Supreme Court of Appeal and Gauteng High Court respectively.
